# Le Mardi Gras

## HISTORICA

A good indicator of a first time visitor to Mardi Gras is requesting a double.

The Greyhound at Le Mardi Gras is often considered one of Pittsburgh's most iconic drinks. We are the only establishment that squeezes fresh citrus per order

The Costanzo family has owned and operated Le Mardi Gras for over 63 years.

From the 1950's through the 1980's, Le Mardi Gras was Pittsburgh's secret after hours watering hole. Only close friends of the owner Joe Costanzo were allowed to drink after business hours were over - often the party would continue till seven in the morning! As social mores and local laws changed, this era came to a close. Le Mardi Gras preserves its special place in the community by being the only neighborhood bar open until 2:30AM, 365 days a year. Alcohol sales stop at 2AM.

The bar you see today is a detailed replica of the original, which was located just down the road on Bellefonte St. Many items were carried over from the original building, including the register, beer taps, tables and most importantly the original artwork.

The murals, from 1954, were commissioned by the original owner and painted by Art Institute of Pittsburgh instructor Tom Kouros. Many of the characters depicted were bar regulars at the time.

Oscar Gendelberg and Benny Parker, the founders of Le Mardi Gras, went on to open another Shadyside hot spot, The Gaslight Club after selling the lounge to Joe Costanzo. The Gaslight Club was next door to Mardi Gras and the two businesses shared many fans.

Jim Brose has been with Le Mardi Gras since 2000, making him one of the longest serving bartenders in Pittsburgh. At his retirement party, customers from all over PA and even out of state came to pay their respects.

In the 1960's, it was not uncommon to see a criminal defense attorney having a drink with their client, and sometimes even the judge themselves...

"The Pittsburgh Connection" referenced in the mafia film Goodfellas is rumored to have been a Le Mardi Gras patron in the 70's

The birth of many a political campaign have been launched late at night at Le Mardi Gras, something which still occurs to this day. In the 1970's Senator John Heinz celebrated his inaugural ceremony in the old Bellefonte Location.

And countless other famous faces who've enjoyed casual anonymity beneath the infamously dim lighting at Le Mardi Gras

In the 70's and 80's, journalists from the Pittsburgh Post Gazette and Pittsburgh Press chose Le Mardi Gras as their after work oasis and could often be heard discussing their latest scoop. To this day, sports journalists can be seen watching the last game of the day while sipping on one of our fine beers.

The jukebox is a vintage NSM Cosmicburst that is almost impossible to buy in complete working order today. Collectively curated by the staff for decades, it includes hits, b-sides and hidden treasures from the early to the late twentieth century.

The Pittsburgh Grand Prix has its origins at Le Mardi Gras. Formulated by enthusiasts of high octane vehicles (and drinks) the very first drivers were regulars here. Le Mardi Gras sponsored vehicles in race at its advent and a photo of one of the cars can still be seen on our walls.

1990's horror film Two Evil Eyes, written and directed by horror legends, George Romero and Dario Argento (Dawn of the Dead) and starring actors Harvey Keitel and Adrienne Barbeau, included scenes shot at Le Mardi Gras

Anthony Bourdain's Parts Unknown (2017) regarded Le Mardi Gras as "the bar everyone wants in their neighborhood"

The cash register at Le Mardi Gras is a National Cash Register Corporation (est. 1884) original. Made in the 1950's, this register is a fully functional antique, a mechanical computer and worth more than any money it could hold.

Our Ms. PacMan is an original tabletop arcade game from 1982 and many customers have noted that Ms. PacMan moves much faster than newer versions of the game. Can you get a high score? Beware, she's hungry for quarters!

The antique cigarette machine at Le Mardi Gras was custom designed in 1960 and features original artwork.

Among the charming trinkets that decorate the lounge, there's a domino hidden in plain sight. Find it and enjoy a beer on the house.

Le Mardi Gras is the best place to celebrate Fat Tuesday in Pittsburgh. On this day we celebrate with a live zydeco band, prizes and souvenirs and hefty New Orleans style cocktails!
